



STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION

Following the ongoing development of Harrier Primary Academy, Aveley, REAch2 are carrying out a consultation asking all stakeholders of the local community whether they are happy for REAch2 Academy Trust to enter into a funding agreement with the Secretary of State to establish a new primary academy. This consultation is in accordance with Section 10 of the Academies Act (2010).

The consultation closing date is **5.00pm on 16th December 2022**.

Background

Harrier Primary Academy will be developed at the end Love Lane in Aveley, Thurrock. Harrier will be a 2FE Primary School, catering for 420 places when full. The Primary School is due to open in September 2023 starting off with offering 30 reception places. The school will grow year on year to address an increase in primary school places in the local area.

In addition, the school will also provide a 26 (FTE) place nursery which will open the follow year in September 2024 operated by the Trust.

The New Primary School:

Location: The new school will be located on 'Love Lane, Aveley, Thurrock, RM15.' The school's full address is yet to be confirmed.

Planned opening date: September 2023

Age range: 2-11 (includes Nursery)
